CANADIAN ANIMALS

Match the Canadian animals with their corresponding description:



GOOSE

This bird appears in the Canadian dollar. It is related to the penguin. Some can live up to 30 years. They migrate to warmer areas around the Gulf of Mexico in the winter, and return to northern lakes when the ice melts.

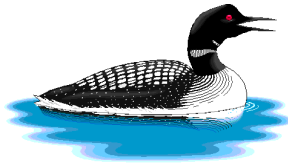

POLAR BEAR

This bird has an excellent eyesight and lives in the tundra. They feed on other small animals (ground squirrels, hares, birds). When there is a lot to eat, she lays up to 10 eggs. The female sits on the eggs to keep them from freezing, and the male brings her food.

LOON

This animal lives in the Arctic. When he comes ashore in the summer he eats plants and berries. He waits by the seal's breathing holes in the ice and quickly snatches the seal when it comes out. He has a very good sense of smell and sometimes breaks into buildings to find food.

MOOSE

This animal has black fur that grows around its eyes. It looks like it is wearing a mask. He climbs down from his tree and looks for food in the evening. His favourite food is crayfish.

SNOWY OWL

It is one of the largest water birds in North America. Only swans are larger. This bird is also called a honker because of the loud, honking sound that the bird makes.

RACCOON

This is a funny-looking animal with very long legs, a humpback and a very short tail and large ears. He can grow to be over 3 metres long and over 2 metres tall. Males have large wide antlers.

BEAVER

These animals like the wooded areas where they can hide in the trees and eat leaves. They shed the antlers in the winter but a new set grows in the summer. They eat the food twice and have four stomachs.

SEAL

They are not seals but close relatives. The adult is huge and can weigh up to 3000 pounds. Their brownish skin is very thick and wrinkled. They have long sharp tusks that help them to climb out of the water and onto the ice.

SKUNK

This is the largest land animal in North America. They are related to buffalo but they are not buffalo. He has brown hair around the head and neck. Its meat is lower in fat and cholesterol than beef.

DEAR

They are mammals that live in the Arctic Ocean. The baby's white coat makes it hard for enemies to see him on the ice. They can stay under water for half an hour. To come up for air, they chew the ice to make breathing holes. They also punch the ice with their heads.

WALRUS

This animal has a black coat with two white stripes down the back and one white stripe up the forehead. He has glands and can shoot a liquid that has a terrible odour. It stiffens its legs, stamps the ground with its feet, snaps its teeth, and its hairs stand up. Then he swings its rear end around, lifts its tail up out of the way and shoots. The spray can go as far as four meters.



BISON

His tail is special. It is flat, has very little hair, and helps him to swim. It also helps him stand on its hind feet and hold the body up. He uses his tail to warn others by slapping it on the water to make a loud noise. This animal's sharp front teeth can cut down trees.
