Spreading?

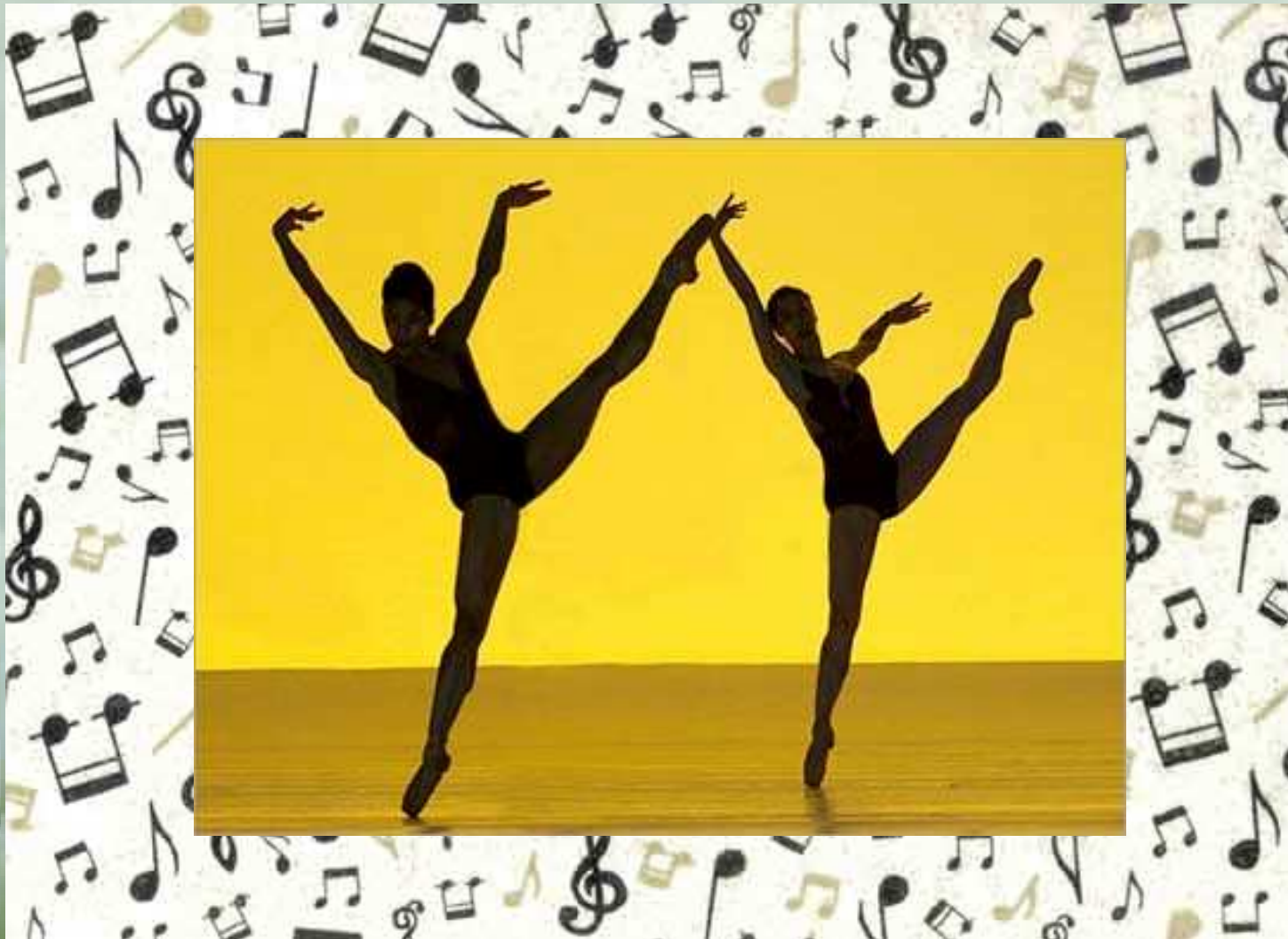
The Netherland is handed out in three parts.

Rules of the Game

- * You play korfbal in the summer on a field of 60 by 30 meters, or in the winter on a field of 40 by 20 meters.
- * Teams how play korfbal exist of 4 women and 4 men
- * How to score?
You have to throw the ball in the basket.
- * How to defend?
You have to stop the ball with your hands, just like basketball. Only it's forbidden to pull you're opponent.
- * If you abuse the rules, the referee can give you a punishment. The opponent can get a free throw.
- * There are many rules, that's way korfbal is a difficult sport.



Integration and problems


Korfball is integration
