There are	(two)	pens on the table	OR There aren't (two) pens on the table. There are (three) pens on the table.
Is there	a	pen on the table?	Yes, there is. / No, there isn't.
Are there	(two)	pens on the table?	Yes, there are. / No, there aren't.

There is = There's

There are → "There are" does not have a contraction form

STATEMENT	NEGATIVE	QUESTION
Plural Nouns I have some cookies.	I don't have any cookies.	Do you have any cookies?
Uncountable Nouns I need some water.	I don't need any water.	Do you need any water?

NOTE 1: With questions in which we expect the answer to be 'Yes', we use 'some' instead of 'any'.
Example: Could you please give me some bananas?

NOTE 2: Some common uncountable nouns include:
coffee, food, homework, information, milk, money, paper, rice, salt, soup, sugar, tea, time, water
