

Sílvia AYMERICH-LEMOS is an author from Barcelona (<u>Catalonia</u>, Europe). She is a member of the Pen Club and of the Association of Writers in Catalan (AELC). As a professional translator, she has rendered a number of literary works from English, French, Occitan and German. As a creative writer, she has published, among other titles, <u>La meva Europa ([My own Europe]</u>, Amadeu Oller Prize for young poets 1985), <u>Berlín Zoo</u> (Cassà's Narrative 1991), <u>Els déus de Califòrnia ([The Gods of California]</u> City of Elx Narrative Prize 1993).

Regarding the field of <u>LabLit</u>, she authored two juvenile novels: <u>Ulls de pantera</u> ([Panther Eyes], 1994) and <u>Gelati!</u> (1998), and co-authored <u>Roger d'Orlhac</u> ([Roger of Aurillac], 2009), all of them <u>translated into Spanish</u>. She is also the author of the digital novel <u>El bloc de l'Eva</u> ([Eva's blog], 2009) supervised by Dr. Josep-Joan Centelles and sponsored by the Catalan Department of Education. As a researcher, she is currently conducting a study on <u>LabLit and gender in Catalan literature</u> under the patronage of the Department of Culture.

Her poetic work has been included in several anthologies and she has also contributed poems translated by herself into French in <u>Forum der Schrifteller</u> (1995) and in <u>Le Pan des Muses</u> (2012), and into English in <u>Malpaís Review</u> (2013).
