Scotland



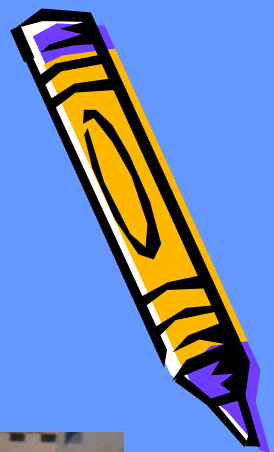
Uniform

- In schools in Scotland, girls wear a skirt, a shirt, a tie, shoes and a blazer.
- Boys wear trousers, a shirt, a tie, shoes and a blazer.



Start of day

- School starts at 9 o'clock and finishes at 3 o'clock in Scotland. Most children walk to school but some children go to school by bus or car.
- On arrival in the classroom children hang their jackets and bags on the pegs in the cloakroom.

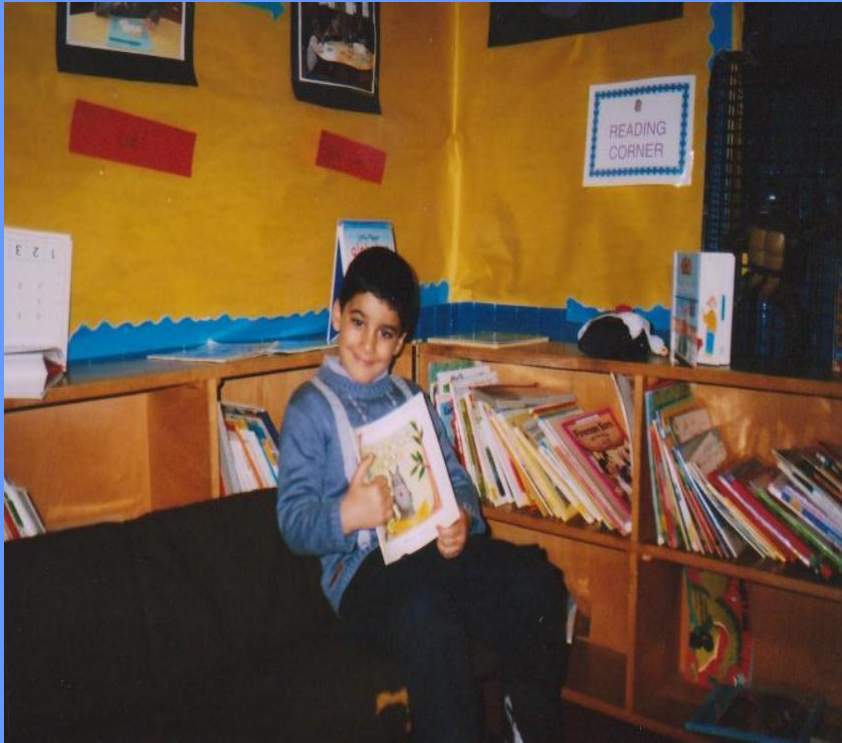


Break time

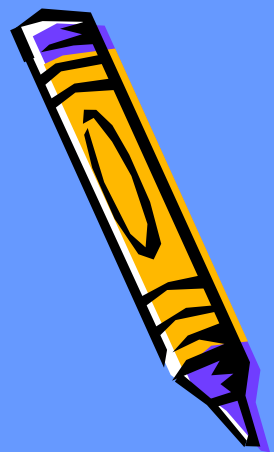
- Children have their break from 10.30-10.45. We normally eat fruit or a couple of biscuits. During break time, pupils go to the playground and play games. Football is very popular.

- In the morning, we have a language lesson. After the break, we have a maths lesson. After lunch, we normally read or do art, computing, music or P.E.



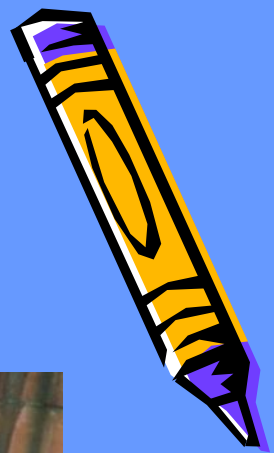
Lunch time

After-school activities

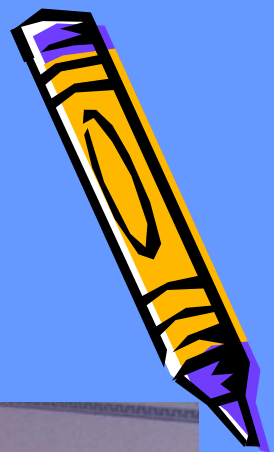


- School finishes at 3 o'clock and there are a lot of after-school activities. Many girls go to dance classes and brownies.
- Many boys go to football and scouts.

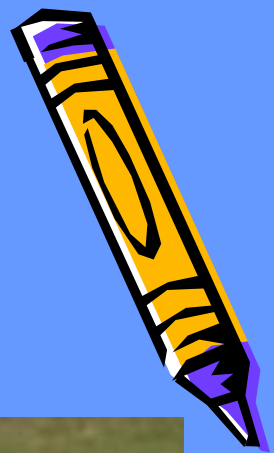


Girls
